D. Sport committees will meet at a pre-season and a post-season meeting each year to discuss the problems related to their activity and to make recommendations to the Board of Athletic Directors for consideration of the Board of Directors. Recommended changes to guidelines shall be made at the post-season meeting.

#### **SECTION 7 SCHOOL SPONSORED TOURNAMENTS/SANCTIONED EVENTS**

A. Any league school sponsoring an invitational tournament shall notify their intention in writing to the league commissioner annually. Completion of the league or NCS sanctioned event form complies with this requirement.

B. All league or school hosted tournaments shall receive commissioner or league approval prior to NCS or State CIF required sanctioning.

#### **SECTION 8 RESPONSIBILITIES OF SCHOOLS HOSTING DVAL OR NCS POST-SEASON EVENTS**

A. Each school shall accept responsibility for hosting league meets for any sport upon the request of the Board of Directors. Costs of any staff coverage, equipment, etc., unusual circumstances and exceptions should be acted upon by the league before commitment. Costs covered by the league are delineated below.

B. The host school of league-sponsored contests should have an adequate number of service personnel, such as ticket sellers, gate people, competent timers, and scorers. Police are assigned as the Event Director deems necessary. Any other expenses are to be cleared, in advance, by the Event Director with the league commissioner.

C. Profits from events hosted by DVAL schools will be retained by the league treasury.

D. The Board of Directors will set pay rates, fees, and admission prices.

#### **SECTION 9 POST-SEASON COMMITMENTS**

The DVAL will conduct post-season qualifying meets and tournaments when necessary. These events fall into two categories:

A. Events where admission fees for spectators are charged when feasible: basketball, soccer, swimming, track, volleyball, water polo, and wrestling.

1. The events listed above will have a paid Meet Director who will be responsible for organizing and conducting the events with the assistance of league member schools.

2. The admission fees are \$5.00 general admission, \$3.00 students with ID and seniors, free under 8 with a parent.

B. Events where no admission fees for spectators are charged: cross-country, golf, tennis, softball, and baseball.

1. The responsibility for conducting these events will be shared by league member schools on a rotating basis (refer to sport guidelines).

**SECTION 14 ELIGIBILITY**

- A. Student athletic eligibility is established and maintained by NCS rules. Refer to NCS Constitution and By-laws.
- B. Each school must verify the current eligibility of all athletic participants in all sports in every season of sport.
- C. Coaches have the option of moving eligible players up and down, between JV, Frosh/Soph, and Varsity on a game-by-game basis, one day at a time, allowing athletes one level of play in one sport per day. Variations in this bylaw maybe covered in individual sports guidelines.

**SECTION 15 TROPHIES, AWARDS, AND CHAMPIONSHIPS**

The Board of Directors shall determine championships in varsity sports. The Board of Directors shall also consider the establishment of awards.

**SECTION 16 MAXIMUM FEES FOR ADMISSION**

- A. Member schools may charge admission for league regular season competition. The following shall be the established **maximum** prices for admission to the Varsity, J.V. and Frosh DVAL athletic contests:

- B. Member schools opting not to charge admission should notify the league commissioner and the other member schools.

\*\* *Booster members from either participating league school receive the booster discount. DVAL schools are opting not to charge for soccer at this time.*

**SECTION 17 COMPLIMENTARY PASSES**

Principals shall determine the persons from the school and community who are to receive complimentary passes. League passes are good for all league events including league playoffs, but not league member school invitational events. Each school will receive the appropriate amount of passes for staff plus one guest, good for member school contests only. Each school will be given up to 100 DVAL coach’s passes. Passes to be used by adults and non-students only.

## Universal Tie-Breaker (Football) (qualifying for the postseason)

The win-loss record(s) of the teams in league play shall determine league seeding for playoff purposes. The league's administrators will determine win-loss records based on previously approved schedules. In the event of a tie, the tie shall be broken using the following procedures:

### 1) Tie Between Two Teams

- a) Head-to-head competition in league play among tied teams.

### 2) Tie Between Three or More Teams

- a) In all cases of ties involving more than two teams, as each team is removed from the tie, all other tied teams revert back to head-to-head competition based on the number of teams remaining in the tie.

- b) Head-to-head competition in league play among tied teams.

- i) Example of multiple team ties:

#### (a) Games

- (i) Team A defeated Team B and Team C
- (ii) Team B defeated Team C but lost to Team A
- (iii) Team C lost to Team A and Team B

#### (b) Mini Standings

- (i) Team A is 2-0
- (ii) Team B is 1-1
- (iii) Team C is 0-2

#### (c) Results

- (i) Team A is awarded highest seed.
- (ii) If applicable, Team B is awarded second highest seed because of head-to-head record against Team C.

- (2) If the tie remains – Thirteen (13) point system:

1. Tied teams will compare their margin of victory with each other in league play. Each team will total their margin of points against the other tied teams with marginal points being the difference in the scores of a game. Winning teams will add the margin of points while losing teams will subtract the margin of points. No more than thirteen (13) points will be added or subtracted in any league game. The team with the highest number of marginal points will be awarded the best possible seed. If there is a tie for highest marginal points, then those tied teams shall revert back to head-to-head to break the tie. Once a team is eliminated, refer back to head-to-head for the remaining teams.

2. Example of 13-point system:

#### a. Games

- i. Team A defeated Team B, 23-7
- ii. Team B defeated Team C, 21-16
- iii. Team C defeated Team A, 10-9

#### (b) Mini-Standings

- (i) Marginal points for A +12
- (ii) Marginal points for B -8
- (iii) Marginal points for C -4

- (3) If the tie remains – Defensive points allowed between tied teams
- (i) Each tied team will total their defensive points allowed up to but not more than thirteen (13) points for each league game with the tied teams. The team with the lowest total is awarded the highest seed. If there is a tie for the lowest defensive point total, the tied teams shall revert back to head-to-head to break the tie. Once one team is eliminated, revert back to head-to-head for the remaining teams.
  - (ii) Example of defensive points with 13-point rule:
    1. **Games**
      - a. Team A defeated Team B, 20-7
      - b. Team B defeated Team C, 20-18
      - c. Team C defeated Team A, 6-3
    2. **Mini-Standings**
      - a. Team A's total defensive points allowed, 13
      - b. Team B's total defensive points allowed, 26
      - c. Team C's total defensive points allowed, 16
    3. **Results**
      - a. Team A is awarded highest seed.
      - b. If applicable, Team B is awarded second highest seed because of head-to-head record against Team C.
- (4) If the tie remains – Defensive points allowed between league teams
1. Each tied team will total their defensive points allowed in all league games up to but not more than thirteen (13) points. The team with the lowest total is awarded the highest seed. If there is a tie for the lowest defensive point total, the tied teams shall revert back to head-to-head to break the tie. Once one team is eliminated, revert back to head-to-head for the remaining teams.
- (5) If the tie remains – Defensive points allowed between tied teams with NO 13-point rule
1. Each tied team will add their total defensive points allowed for each league game with the other tied teams. The team with the lowest total is awarded the highest seed. If there is a tie for the lowest defensive point total, the tied teams shall revert back to head-to-head to break the tie. Once one team is eliminated, revert back to head-to-head for the remaining teams.
  2. Example of defensive points with 13-point rule:
    - a. **Games**
      - i. Team A defeated Team B, 20-7
      - ii. Team B defeated Team C, 20-18
      - iii. Team C defeated Team A, 6-3
    - b. **Mini-Standings**
      - i. Team A's total defensive points allowed, 13
      - ii. Team B's total defensive points allowed, 38
      - iii. Team C's total defensive points allowed, 23
    - c. **Results**
      - i. Team A is awarded highest seed.
      - ii. If applicable, Team B is awarded second highest seed because of head-to-head record against Team C.

(6) If the tie remains – Defensive points allowed between league teams with NO 13-point rule

(i) Each tied team will add their total defensive points allowed for each league game. The team with the lowest total is awarded the highest seed. If there is a tie for the lowest defensive point total, the tied teams shall revert back to head-to-head to break the tie. Once one team is eliminated, revert back to head-to-head for the remaining teams.

(7) If the above procedures do not break the tie, the following procedures will be used:

(i) A coin flip will be conducted by the league commissioner from the affected league at a site to be determined by the league commissioner and attended by the principal and/or athletic director of the affected schools.
